Recommendation: Authorize EPC Executive Director to hire outside counsel, authorize Executive Director to litigate, and authorize Executive Director to execute resolution documents.

Brief Summary: An automotive company has tampered or altered software to pass emission tests in its vehicles. This activity violates the EPC Act and rules promulgated by the EPC Commission. Outside counsel have been authorized by California federal court to initiate lawsuits and settlements in this matter. EPC can recover penalties for violation of our Act and rules more effectively by utilizing outside counsel already involved in nationwide litigation.

Financial Impact: Litigation will be handled by outside legal counsel that only recover fees and costs if they prevail, thus no anticipated financial impact.

Background: An automotive company has tampered and/or altered software to pass emission tests in its vehicles that operate in Hillsborough County. These activities violate the EPC Act and rules promulgated by the EPC Commission. Outside counsel have been authorized by a California federal court to initiate lawsuits and settlements in this matter. EPC can recover penalties and costs for violation of our Act and rules more effectively by using outside counsel already involved in the nationwide litigation. The outside counsel also hope to proactively find resolution to the overall correction of the vehicles as well. The Executive Director is seeking authority to hire outside counsel, litigate the case and execute settlement documents.
